

TJ's Tips

When repairing a hole in film covering, the edges of the repair patch will often loosen and pooch up as you shrink the central area of the patch. My technique will greatly reduce or eliminate this problem. After ironing down the perimeter of the patch using the film's adhesive temp setting, let the repair area cool, and apply 2 layers of masking tape to the perimeter where the patch has been adhered to the original covering. Set the iron to the shrink temperature and shrink (heat) the central area of the patch. Let the area cool, and remove the tape. The tape should insulate the patch's adhesive perimeter so the adhesive does not loosen which would allow the whole patch to loosen at the higher film shrinking temperature.


