If you're planning on flying any or all of the three days in the Comets Only Fun Float Fly, Friday thru Sunday, 18, 19 and 20 November) you need to know that you MUST be there by 9 AM at the very latest... 8:30 AM is better. There will be a Park Ranger there from 8 AM to 9 AM ONLY, to inspect models for quagga mussels before they will be allowed in the water.

If you arrive late and miss this inspection YOU <u>WILL NOT</u> BE ALLOWED TO FLY. Simple as that.
