Repair/Repaving the Runway

GREAT progress with the fund raising effort. There have been no new contributions in the past few weeks, but we have about \$15,000 in donations. This coupled with the \$10,000 we already committed from the treasury, brings us to a total of about \$25,000. Our goal is \$30,000.

We have submitted an application to the AMA for a Flying Site Improvement Grant. It could provide additional funds, but we are competing with other AMA clubs who are applying for a similar grant. There is a limited pot of grant money allocated by the AMA, and we won't know until next April how successful our application is. Hopefully the AMA will approve a grant for our runway repaving project, perhaps as much as \$3,000. Thanks to all of you who have donated to this effort, and let's keep up the momentum!

Election of New Officers

My call for volunteers to offer their name as a candidate for club president went unanswered. As I stated in the September Tale, if there were no candidates, I would serve another term as your president. TJ will continue to serve as Treasurer. Berny Hammer and Dennis Fingold will be serving their second year of a two year term as Vice President and Safety Officer, respectively.


New Business:
