
The Comets Tale

Motion to approve old minutes was submitted, seconded and approved.

Old Business:

- 1. Check our club airplane by-laws for requirement to have a switch or disconnect on all electric planes. Mike and Greg could not find any written requirement. Group discussion with the following points addressed.
- a. Install a fuse, switch or Deans plug
- b. Switch or plug is a point of failure
- c. Check our LiPo Safety document for electrical switch requirements
- d. Member Greg read the following safety documents from our website
 - i. <u>Ventura County Comets AMA Chapter 173 Li-Po Power Compliance Safety Form</u>
 - ii. Ventura County Li-Po Battery RC Aircraft Safety Check List
- e. The Li-Po Safety Check List is an Airworthiness Review which states: **The ultimate responsibility** for the safety and airworthiness of this aircraft rests solely with the owner and/or pilot.
- f. The Safety Checklist also has a line addressing a "kill switch". **Kill Switch/throttle adjustment properly set (Can I kill the engine with the radio?)** This was discussed and noted that members need to check that our throttle kill switch is "On" before connecting the battery to the plane.

New Business:

- 1. What can we do for deceased members whose families have donated their plane collection to our club. The following ides were discussed.
- a. Send their name to the AMA website for publication
- b. Donate \$100 to the AMA from club donations raised from the proceeds of the donated airplanes.
- c. Buy a commemorative brick from the AMA, with the members name to be placed in the Walk of Fame, Muncie, IA.
 - i. Mike will check on the cost
- 2. Public Outreach-We discussed many avenues to create interest and inform local people of our club and great facility at Lake Casitas.
- a. Displays at local businesses
- b. 4th of July parade participation-Trailer required
- c. STEM event held at Camarillo airport includes robotics, drones and planes
- d. Ventura County Fair exhibit at the Home Arts section
- e. Flying Field Open House-Cost per guest car at \$20 each is prohibitive
- f. Push/Pull Parade in Ventura-Wagons with planes
- 3. Santa Maria Fun Fly was attended by Mike and he saw a huge variety of planes.
- 4. Tri-Valley R.C. Modelers have lost their flying field in Santa Maria.
- 5. Contact S.C Edison Drone operator to come to a club meeting and share their knowledge and experience flying drones for power line inspections.
- 6. Ojai Pharmacy, next to the hospital in Ojai, has the new and improved COVID booster shot available.

Safety:

- 1. Greg reminded everyone to go to the AMA website and complete the **Recreational UAS Safety Test (TRUST),** which is a collaboration between the FAA and industry to provide TRUST and educational material to Recreational Flyers.
- 2. Upon completion of the test recreational flyers should print or save a digital copy of their completion certificate and keep it on their person when they fly. The Academy of Model Aeronautics cannot re-issue your completion certificate if it is lost. The FAA cannot re-issue your completion certificate. Should you lose your completion certificate, you will need to re-take TRUST and obtain a new certificate.
- 3. Time to complete the test is 15-30 minutes. This an open-book test which you take until you pass, impossible to fail.
- 4. **Restrain, Restrain Restrai**n your aircraft before starting your engine or connecting a battery to your aircraft. We have a few near misses due to unrestrained aircraft t our flying filed.
