My goal, with help from the Board members, is to make contact with all the RC clubs in the greater south west asking for their help with promoting our Go Fund Me campaign to their respective membership. The more we make contact with folks that have similar interest in model building and flying, the greater the potential for contributions. I can't emphasize enough how important it is for each one of us to take a couple of minutes and pass along our funding goal to friends, family members and fellow flyers. I did this the day we launched the campaign. I hope you have taken the initiative to do the same. We have also updated out Comets web site with an announcement on the banner page about the fund raising effort and a link to the Go Fund Me site.

To date (9-3-20) we have received over \$6,000 in contributions. Most have come through the Go Fund Me site, but a few have also come from contributions to TJ, either directly or through the mail. We are doing great, given that the campaign was launched just a little over a week ago! What is important is to keep the momentum with getting the word out. Hopefully, when potential contributors see the generosity of those that have given so far, they will feel compelled to also put some money in the pot. 
End of Business Topics
